This day came the plaintiff

By their attornies [sic] and thereupon came a jury of good and lawful men to wit: William Clara, John Scoggin, Robert Gamble, Isaac Russell, Christopher Steakley, Isaac Brown, Hercules Ogle, David H. Mayburn, John Harper, Stephen Crain, James Bounds, William ____ and **William Rotton** who being sworn well and truly to inquire of Damages in this Suit upon their oaths do say that the plaintiff hath sustained damages by occasion of the Defendant now performance of the assumption in the Declaration mentioned to the sum of Seventy nine Dollars besides his costs. Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the Defendant his Damages in form aforesaid assessed and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf defended — and the said Defendant in mercy of.

Comment: The above juror named *William* ____ could have been William Wilson, William Clara, William Pryer, or William Robinson because all four men were called to jury duty the day before on 12 February 1810. I could not read the surname or any letter in it.

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
