**Content of record:**

This day came the parties by their attornies [sic] and thereupon came a Jury of good and lawful men to wit: Jacob Anderson Senr., Enoch Odle, **Richard M. Rottan**, James Townsend, William M. Bryant, Robert Howard, Jesse N. Thomas, Henry Lyda, Spence Mitchell, George Sugg, John Williams and John Crook Senr. who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their oaths do say that the defendant with nothing of the Debt, in the Declaration mentioned as in pleading he both alledged [sic]. It is herefore considered by the Court that the plaintiff take nothing by his Bill but for his false clamor he in Mercy etc. and that the Defendant go hence without day and recover against the plaintiff his cost by him about his defence [sic] in this behalf expended.

**Comment: The numbering in this volume jumps from page 239 to page 249, meaning that the page that follows 239 is labeled 249. No content seems to be lost. It is simply wrongly numbered.**
