Content of cause:

This day came the parties by
their attornies [sic] and thereupon came a jury of good and lawful men
to wit: William Donnelly, William Clara, John Scoggin, Robert Gamble,
Christopher Steakley, Isaac Brown, Hercules Ogle, David H. Mayburn,
Stephen Crane, James Bounds, **William Rottan** and John Harper who being
elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined went out of court.

Comment: *Trespass vi et armis* is the common-law action for damages for any injury committed by the defendant with direct and immediate force or violence against the plaintiff or his property, according to *Black's Law Dictionary*, Fifth Edition (1979), 1348.
