



John W. Cauble

John W. Cauble (12 Feb 1816-23 Jun 1868 Hill Co. TX; buried Old Woodbury Cemetery, Hill Co. TX) married **Mary Eveliza Chaney** (01 Oct 1819 VA-20 Feb 1907 Dewey Co. OK; buried Dewey Cemetery, Roger Mills Co. OK) about 1838 probably in Sabine County, Texas. The couple had seven children. Eveliza was a Methodist and her life—lived always on the moving frontier—was surely one that demanded faith. John W. Cauble as a private in Company B, Liberty County, from 22 June to 02 October 1846. On 18 March 1864, the 48-year-old John W. Cauble enlisted as Third Sergeant in Company G, Hill County, First Regiment Cavalry, 2nd. Brigade TST, CSA. After completing Civil War duty, he returned to his farm, dying three years later.

C1 Mary R. [Mollie] Cauble (23 Nov 1838 TX-17 Sep 1907 or 1908 Tarrant Co. TX; buried Whites Chapel Cemetery, Tarrant Co. TX), a daughter of Evaliza Chaney and John W. Cauble, married **Thomas Henry Hughes** (1832 Rankin or Jones Co. MS-c1929 KS) about 1853. The couple had four children before Hughes left for Kansas reportedly with the two older sons and Mollie and the two young children remained in Hill County, Texas. Hughes enlisted at Brownsville in Texas Mounted Volunteers, Texas Rangers Frontier Battalion, under Captain G. K. Lewis. His service ran from 28 September 1852 until his discharge on 22 March 1853.

Mollie Cauble Hughes later married **Jackson Puckett** (1820 TN-11 Aug 1889 Hood Co. TX; buried Rock Church Cemetery, Hood Co. TX) 13 December 1864 in Hamilton County, Texas, and had a daughter. Puckett served as a private in Capt. Shapley P. Ross' Company during the Mexican War. He commanded 30th Regiment, Texas Cavalry during Civil War.

C2 Elvira B. Cauble (1842 Tyler Co. TX-unknown), a daughter of Evaliza Chaney and John W. Cauble, married Ira Mathews (1838 MS-28 Feb 1918 Confederate Soldiers Home, buried State Cemetery, Austin, TX). They had three children. Matthews served in Company H, 19th Texas Cavalry, Parson's Brigade, Army of the Trans-Mississippi during the Civil War.

C3 John W. Cauble, Jr. (1844 Tyler Co. TX-18 Apr 1864 Battle of Poison Springs, AR; buried battlefield cemetery), a son of Evaliza Chaney and John W. Cauble, did not marry and had no known children. He died in the Civil War, serving in the same unit as his brother, James K. Polk Cauble.

C4 James K. Polk Cauble (14 Mar 1846 Tyler Co. TX-18 Feb 1913 Somervell Co. TX of cancer; buried Georges Creek Cemetery, Somervell Co. TX), a son of Evaliza Chaney and John W. Cauble, first married **Sarah Ann Arnot** (27 Mar 1844 MS-22 Oct 1897 Johnson Co. TX). The couple had six children before Sarah's death. James K. Polk Cauble served in 30th Regiment, Texas Cavalry [1st Texas Partisan Rangers] in Captain Jackson Puckett's Company during the Civil War.

When Sarah contracted tuberculosis in the 1890s, **Mrs. Mahalia Harris McPherson** (14 May 1859 Newbury, Green Co. IN-07 Jul 1939 Cleburne, Johnson Co. TX), a widow, was hired to care for the family. After Sarah died, James K. Polk Cauble married Mrs. McPherson on 28 May 1898 in Somervell County and had two common children.

C5 Napoleon Bonaparte Cauble (29 Sep 1848 Tyler Co. TX-27 Jan 1873 Hill Co. TX; buried in Old Woodbury Cemetery, Hill Co. TX), son of Evaliza Chaney and John W. Cauble, married **Mary A. Casin** (Nov 1852 GA-unknown). They had two children before his death. He was too young to serve in the Civil War.

C6 Rosanna [Roxanna/Annie] B. Cauble (29 Dec 1850 Tyler Co. TX-03 Jun 1893; buried Rock Church Cemetery, Hood Co. TX), a daughter of Mary Evaliza Chaney and John W. Cauble, married **James Parks Eberhart** (27 February 1848 Hall Co. GA-10 Jul 1928 Hood Co. TX; buried Rock Church Cemetery, Hood Co. TX) about 1867 in Johnson County, Texas. The couple had five children before Annie died. James Parks Eberhart served in Company C, 48th Alabama Infantry, during the Civil War, enlisting at age 15 on 12 March 1863.

C7 Jessie Loucinda Cauble (01 Apr 1853 Hill Co. TX-08 Oct 1923 Lea Co. NM; buried Lovington Cemetery, Lea Co. NM) was the youngest child of Eveliza Chaney and John W. Cauble. When Lucinda was age 14, she married **George Washington Wood** (25 Dec 1846 Hall Co. GA-28 Feb 1934 Amarillo, Potter Co. TX; buried Lovington Cemetery,
