# Peter Cauble Descendants Meet in Brownwood for Third Reunion

#### **Caubles Meet For Annual Reunion**

The Cauble Family Association met for its annual reunion 13-15 July 1990 at Lake Brownwood. Fifty-five Peter Cauble descendants, spouses, and friends attended. Each descendant was assigned a unique number to denote his or her lineage. Letters A through J were given the children of Peter and Mary Ann Rotan Cauble. The first offspring of a letter was noted as 1 (that is, the first child of Isaac Butler Cauble [E] was James Lafayette Cauble [E1]; first child of James Lafayetter was George Clinton Cauble [E11]. When a family has ten or more children, the registrar uses a period before and after 10 (or larger number) .

### **James Sterling Cauble Elected**

James Sterling Cauble E7223, son of Jay Spivey Cauble of Breckenridge, became the third president of the Cauble Family Association during the annual business meeting on Sunday, 15 July 1990, at the Cauble reunion. James grew up at Albany and graduated from Texas A&M in 1963 with a degree in engineering. He is married to the former Ernestine Jackson of Lovington, New Mexico. James and Ernestine have two children, Dalinda, who will be an Aggie fish in August, and Ty, who enters fifth grade this fall. James is the Houston Division Manager for Halliburton Logging Services. Although James and his family lived in Odessa for fifteen years, they have resided in Katy for the last two. If you have suggestions for the reunion, please contact James.

### **Peter Cauble House Restored**

About 1839 Peter Cauble built his landmark house in northeastern Tyler County two miles west of the Polk County line and near the crossing of the Nacogdochesto-Liberty and the Jorden Ferry-to-Moscow roads. The double-log, dog-trot structure was made of hewn logs, probably prepared by slaves. During the Civil War, the house was the center of Home Guard activities and of social affairs. The house was well known to travelers

and to local people.

After Peter Cauble's death on 8 March 1870, the family of his daughter, Helen Elmira Cauble Burch and her hus-Valentine **Ignatius** band, Burch, owned and lived in the house. After Burch died 26 November 1892, daughter Angeline Burch Poindexter and husband Robert Lynn Poindexter, raiser their family in the old Cauble house. The house passed from the Poindexters to John H. Kirby, to the Cade family, and to Governor Allan

Shivers before Temple-EasTex, Inc., acquire it and the surrounding land for timber harvesting.

In the 1970s, Cauble descendants [James Cauble E7223, Reba Hughes Torres C14.10.4, and Doris Ruth Hughes C14.10.5] began to visit the place and to worry about its future. Many more descendants found the old house and cemetery in the 1980s. They too worried that hunters camping there might carelessly, but unintentionally, burn the place or that the decaying house would slowing sink into the ground. Cauble descendants organized and began writing letters to Temple-EasTex in 1988, asking the management to find a solution for the house. Finally, the corporation wrote a letter to this editor asking for proof that the house would be managed by a non-profit organization since the Temple-Inland Foundation had voted a small grant to apply toward its repairs. At that time the Cauble family knew the house could be saved. The editor contacted Christine Moor

Sanders of Tyler County Heritage Society for help. That organization took the project since the Cauble family had acquired the grand and the blessings of EasTex. Early in 1990 the corporation informed Heritage Society and this editor of the decision to deed the house, cemetery, and the five surrounding acres to Tyler County Heritage Society. Jack Whitmeyer of the society kept the Cauble Family Association informed and found a group to provide the labor

and technical expertise needed for repairing the old house.

Fellowship Baptist Church of Nederland, Texas, which operates Camp TA-KU-LA, a nearby Christian retreat, worked on the repairs aided by supplies which were contributed by Cauble descendants and by others interested in the preservation of the house of our ancestors, a piece of Tyler County history.

Tyler County Heritage Society leased the property to Camp TA-KU-LA for use as an office and VIP housing. The society and the Cauble

Family Association have use of the grounds for meetings, picnics, cemetery ceremonies, and visits, as well as family reunions. If you want to visit the Historic Peter Cauble House and the Cauble-Burch Cemetery, stop at the camp and meet the full-time director. He will unlock the gate and allow you to stay as long as you like.
