Content of record:

This day came the parties by their attornies [sic] and there upon came a Jury of good and lawful men
To wit: John Walker, Elijah Nelson, George Sugg, Joel Melton, Eliphalit? Baker, Robert Reed, Mathias Ander-
son, Christopher Catron, Finch Worley, James Anderson Snr. John Crook Snr. and William Burden, who being
elected, tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issued Joined, upon their oaths do say that the Defendant is
not Guilty in manner and form as charged in the Declaration as in pleading he hath alledged [sic]. It is therefore
considered by the Court that the plaintiff take nothing by his bill, but for his false claims in lee in mercy &. And
that the Defendant go hence without day, and recover against the plaintiff his cost by him about his defence [sic]
in this behalf expended.
