This day came the

parties by their attornies [sic] and thereupon came a jury of good and lawful men to wit: William Clary, John Scoggin, Robert Gamble, Isham Russell, Christopher Steakley, Isaac Brown, Hercules Ogle, David H. Mayburn, Stephen Crain, James Bounds, **William Rotton**, and John Harper, who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their oaths do say, that the Defendants are not guilty of throwing stones in the original warrant as in pleading they have alledged [sic]. Therefore it is considered by the Court that they be acquitted and discharged of the Riot aforesaid and go thereof without day and recover against Morris and Priscilla Blackwell the prosecutors aforesaid their costs by them in this behalf expended of—On motion of the prosecutors by their attorneys a rule is admitted to show cause why the Judgment aforesaid shout be set aside. Not sustained.
