## Content of cause:

This day came the parties by
their attornies [sic] and thereupon came a jury of good and lawful men
to wit: William Donnelly, William Clara, John Scoggin, Robert Gamble,
Christopher Steakley, Isaac Brown, Hercules Ogle, David H. Mayburn,
Stephen Crane, James Bounds, William Rottan and John Harper who being
elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined went out of court.

**Comment**: Trespass vi et armis is the common-law action for damages for any injury committed by the defendant with direct and immediate force or violence against the plaintiff or his property, according to Black's Law Dictionary, Fifth Edition (1979), 1348.
