Content of record:

This day came the parties by their Attornies [sic] and thereupon came a jury of good and lawful men to wit: Isaac Brown, Jacob Anderson Senr., **Richard M. Rottan**, James Townsend, John Williams, John Crook Senr. Hardy Jones, Woodson P. White, Ericus Smith, David Phillips, Ephraim Alexander & Benjamin Burden who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their oaths do say that the Defendant doth owe unto the plaintiff the sum of Twenty four Dollars besides costs as in pleading he hath alledged [sic]. It is therefore considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the Defendant his debt in form aforesaid assessed together with his cost about his suit in this behalf expended and the said Defendant in Mercy etc.
