Content of record:

This day came the parties by their attornies [sic] and thereupon came a jury of good and lawful men to wit: Jacob Anderson Senr., **Richard M. Rotten**, John Williams, Thomas Gist, William Ridge, Samuel B. Smith, David Smith, John Crook Senr. Ephraim Alexander, James Townsend, Robert Pucket and Hardy Jones, who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their oaths do say that the Defendant doth owe unto the plaintiff two dollars as in pleading he hath alledged [sic]. It is therefore considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the Defendant his debt aforesaid in form aforesaid assessed together with his Cost about his suit in this behalf expended and the said Defendant in Mercy etc.
