# Green Family Research

The following was taken from the file of Aaron Green, General Land Office, Austin, Texas. The cover reads: *File 205, Liberty 3rd Class, Aaron Green.* Researcher: Julia Cauble Smith

Corrected Field Notes of a Survey for Aaron Green of Two hundred acres of land, situated about 18 miles North 13° W. from the town of Woodville, lying in Tyler County Texas, near the Neches River, being a part of the land to which he is entitled by virtue of Certificate No 2, 2<sup>nd</sup> Class, issued by the Board of Land Commissioners for the County of Howard, in the Republic of Texas, now Tyler County Texas:

Beginning at a stake in W. line of the Obediah Hullett 320 acre survey on the W. bank of Neches River, 310 vs from his N.W. cor. <sup>a stake</sup> from which a white oak mkd X br N. 50° E 6 vs. a hickory mkd H br N 70° E 7 vs, this being the N.E. cor. of this survey.

Thence S 20 vs branch runs E. 1062 vs to N.E. cor. of R. J. Commander survey a stake from which a P.O. 18 in dia mkd A. G. br N. 81 W 12 1/10 vs pine 7 in dia mkd X br N. 73 E 5 vs.

Thence W. 430 vs branch runs N. 1062 1/10 vs to stake in E. line of J. B. Wilson survey.

Thence N. 21 vs a branch runs N.E. 50 vs a do. 1062 1/10 vs a stake from which a cypress 18 in dia mkd A. G. br S. 57 E 4 vs, and an overcup oak 14 in dia mkd X br S. 67 W 3 2/10 vs.

Thence E 364 vs branch runs N.E. 1062 1/10 vs to place of beginning, containing 200 acres of land.

The original survey of said tract of land was made July 17, 1844, by C. Holshouser, D. S. L. C., Butler Cauble and Richard Green being chain carriers, and these are the corrected field notes of the same. Resurveyed May 29, 1890.
