## Auction To Benefit the Cauble Fund

The Texas Cauble Family Association again asks the support of each descendant for its second annual auction and sale, which are the principal fund raisers of the organization. If these events are profitable, Texas Caubles will be able to give money to the maintenance of the historic Peter Cauble House in Tyler County, to the care of ancestral cemeteries in various counties, and to other worthy Cauble and allied families or historical projects.

The funds raised in 1993 went towards a new roof for the Cauble House. President Roy Hughes and the other officers have suggested that the 1994 fund be used for the maintenance of ancestral cemeteries. The cemeteries listed in the Cauble Registry, which is the only source we have for determining the burial places of early Cauble descendants, are Albany in Shackelford County, Bold Springs in McLennan County, Cauble-Burch in Tyler County, Fairmount in Tom Green County, Fairview in Midland County, George's Creek in Somervell County, Greenleaf in Brown County, Hardin in Jefferson County, Arkansas, Hico in Hamilton County, McCaulley in Fisher County, Masonic in Howard County, Mt. Olive in Howard County, Old Woodbury in McLennan County, Prairie Grove in Hill County, Rosehill in Tarrant County, Riverside in Wichita County, Roby in Fisher County, Rock Church in Hood County, Rosston in Cooke County, Stiles in Reagan County, Valley Mills in Bosque, Vaughn in Hill County, Wesley Chapel in Erath, White Chapel in Tarrant County, and Zavalla in Angelina County.

The auction, crafts sale, and Cauble Fund were ideas of Roy Hughes and under his leadership the organization has defined its goals and moved towards their completion. The Texas Cauble Family Association appreciates the effective leadership the organization has experienced over the past two years. As Roy leaves office, he goes knowing he made a difference!
