


Image: Kenneth Wayne Howell, *Texas Confederate, Reconstruction Governor* (College Station: Texas A&M Press, 2008), front cover.

He was Governor of Texas during Reconstruction after the Civil War. The governor was a direct descendant, as are we, of **William Rotan** of White County, Tennessee.

The Rotan-Throckmorton Family

Susan Jane Rotan (about 1798 KY-28 Dec 1838 AR) was a daughter of **Rosey Middleton?** (1770s-before 1820 White County, TN) and **William Rotan** (about 1762-by 5 July 1841 White County, TN) and a sister of our **Mary Ann Rotan**. Since Susan's family lived in Barren County, Kentucky, at the time of her birth, Susan was surely born in Kentucky. She married a frontier doctor named **William Edward Throckmorton** (1 Oct 1796 VA-2 Oct 1843; buried Throckmorton Cemetery, Collin County, TX) on 10 December 1818 at Sparta, White County, Tennessee, where her family lived. Susan Jane Rotan and Dr. Throckmorton had eight children as they lived in Tennessee, Illinois, and Arkansas before Susan died.

By May 1836 William E. Throckmorton migrated with his family to Washington County, Arkansas, where Susan died late in 1838. Although Susan Rotan Throckmorton was dead by the time her father's estate was probated, her children were named as heirs of his estate on 18 April 1845 in White County, Tennessee. Her children were: **1) William Albion Little Throckmorton** (20 Sep 1819 Sparta, White County, TN-1856 Benton, AR) who married **Mary Eliza Fletcher** in March 1840; **2) Mary Lee Throckmorton** (14 Dec 1821 White County, TN-20 January 1822 White County, TN); **3) Dr. John Augustus Throckmorton** (7 January 1823 Sparta, White County, TN-unknown) who first married **Nancy Garnett** on 1 November 1842 and secondly **Martha Hill Tucker** on 28 December 1872; **4) Dr. James Webb Throckmorton** (1 Feb 1825 Sparta, White County, TN-21 Apr 1894; buried Stoney Point Cemetery, Collin

County, TX), who married **Anne Rattan** (25 Mar 1829-31 Oct 1895; buried Stoney Point Cemetery, Collin County, TX), a descendant of **John Rattan** who was probably our **William Rotan's** brother, in February 1848 and later became governor of Texas; **5) Robert Middleton Throckmorton** (29 Jan 1828 Illinois-1863 Battle of Mansfield, LA) who married **Eva Fish**; **6) Lucy Jane Throckmorton** (23 Mar 1831-25 May 1832); **7) Nancy Hampton Throckmorton** (3 Apr 1836 Fayetteville, Washington County, AR-1878) who married **James Meredith Wilcox** in June 1856. An eighth child's name was not recorded.

Reportedly, Dr. William Throckmorton remained in Arkansas for a time after Susan Jane Rotan Throckmorton died. Then he took his family to Illinois for a short time before moving back to Arkansas. On 24 January 1841 Dr. Throckmorton married **Malinda Clements** and brought his family to the Republic of Texas, settling on Throckmorton Creek located northeast of McKinney, near Melissa, Texas, in Collin County. Their neighbors were **William R. Garnett**, **Garrett Fitzgerald**, and **Littleton Rattan**.

Governor **James Webb Throckmorton**, educated as both a physician and a lawyer, became one of the most noted politician of nineteenth-century Texas with many fine achievements. He fought Indians in his early Texas days and in later years supported the railroad in an attempt to improve the economy of North Texas. As governor he fought for the right of civil government to prevail over military rule. We can be proud of this Rotan descendant who held to conservative principles when Radicals attempted to capture Texas! He lived in troubled times—much like ours today.

In 1948 they moved to Pine Bluff and lived with Loretta's parents, but Monroe had to return to the sanatorium in 1949. Loretta became a beautician and operated a shop in Booneville for more than forty years and lived there for the remainder of her active life. She was the mother of **Oran Burt** and grandmother of **Jenifer Burt Mounger** and **Jason Burt**. She is survived by two sisters—**Juanita Hughes Bright** of Hope and **Lorene Hughes Cassity** of Booneville, Arkansas.
